

TERMS OF REFERENCE

FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO CONDUCT RESEARCH ON THE IMPLEMENTATION AND IMPACT OF THE INCREMENTAL INTRODUCTION OF AFRICAN LANGUAGES IN THE FORMER MODEL C SCHOOLS ON BEHALF OF PanSALB.

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1 The Pan South African Language Board (PanSALB) is hereby requesting proposals for conducting research on the implementation and impact of the Incremental Introduction of African Languages (IIAL Strategy) in the former Model C schools for a period of nine (9) months.
- 1.2 The Research consultant shall provide research on the following themes:
 - a. Implementation of the strategy in Gauteng, Limpopo, Mpumalanga, Eastern Cape, KwaZulu-Natal, and North-West Provinces
 - b. Impact of the strategy
 - c. Recommendations

2. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The Pan South African Language Board (PanSALB) is a constitutional institution established in terms of Section 6(5) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa (Act No. 108 of 1996, herein the Constitution). The Constitution provides, through national legislation, that PanSALB must promote and create conditions for the development of and use of:
 - (i) all official languages
 - (ii) the Khoe, Nama and San languages
 - (iii) the South African Sign Language

and promote and ensure respect for all languages commonly use by communities in South Africa for heritage and religious purposes.

- 2.2 Sections 30 and 31 of the Constitution stipulate that everyone has a right to use the language and to participate in the cultural life of their choice and may not be denied the right to enjoy their culture, practice their religion and use their language.
- 2.3 Section 32 of the Constitution provides for the right of access to any information held by the state and Section 33 guarantees the right to administrative action that is lawful, reasonable, and procedurally fair.
- 2.4 The Pan South African Language Board Act (No. 59 of 1995 as amended by Act No. 10 of 1999, herein PanSALB Act) stipulates that PanSALB, amongst others: Section 2(a) shall initiate research and studies aimed at promoting and creating conditions for the development and use of:
- All the official languages Republic.
 - The Khoe, Nama and San Languages
 - South African Sign Language

Section 2(c) initiate studies and research aimed at-

- the development of previously marginalized languages of South Africa.
- the non-diminution of rights relating to language and the status of languages existing as at 27 April 1994;

Section 2 (f) The board shall-

- make funds available for this subsection for such period and subject to such conditions as the Board may from time to time determine.
- may commission any person or body of persons or institution to conduct research and prepare publications on its behalf and may for this purpose make resources available to any such person or body of persons or institution.

- make recommendations regarding any proposed or existing legislation on, practice, and policy dealing directly or indirectly with language matters at any level of government.

3. OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 Overall objective of the Request for Quotation (RFQ) is to invite reputable research consultants to submit their proposals for Research on the implementation and impact of the Incremental Introduction of African Languages in the former model C schools on behalf of the Board.
- 3.2 The reputable researchers should be conversant with the language in education policies and geographical preferences of the eight (8) provinces.
- 3.3 50% of the work must be reported as part of the progress report within a period of six (6) months.
- 3.4 The appointed researcher consultant should be able to finalize the research and produce a report within nine (9) months.
- 3.5 The research consultant must be willing to be vetted to verify its research profile.
- 3.6 The research consultant must be willing to provide employment opportunities to qualifying youth especially those with language-related qualifications.
- 3.7 Based on the proposal received and articulating how a service provider will assist PanSALB with this Research, it intends to select a preferred Service Provider to conclude a Service Level Agreement (SLA).

4. SCOPE OF WORK



- 4.1 In this context, research' means the scientific systematic collection of data and analysis in the eight (8) provinces as well as providing recommendations that will be used for reviewing language in education policies and to strengthen the organization's oversight function.
- 4.2 The research consultant will be required to conduct a comparative analysis of data between the eight (8) provinces and the research already conducted in the Western Cape.
- 4.3 The research consultant is expected to provide a detailed and costed project plan for approval before commencing with the project.
- 4.4 The research consultant must provide a detailed progress report on the achievement of each research milestone as per the project plan and as and when deemed necessary by the Board.

5. DISQUALIFICATIONS

- 5.1. Any non-disclosure of any information about this bid will result in disqualification.
- 5.2. Non-compliance with the bid requirements will invalidate the bid; and
- 5.3. Non-compliance with all the applicable Acts, Regulations, and by-laws will result in the disqualification of the bid.

- 9.3. Where, however, the special conditions of contract conflict with the general conditions of contract, the general conditions of contract will prevail.
- 9.4. Failure to comply with the above-mentioned conditions will invalidate the quotation.
- 9.5. Certified copy of B-BBEE certificate issued by a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a sworn affidavit must be submitted with the completed SBD forms.
